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Preserved Pension

I was due a preserved pension with a tax-free gratuity on my 60th birthday, which was on the 13th September this year. To claim this I sent the completed form by DHL letter more than 3 months previously on the 6th June. As the enclosed documents show, it was signed for in the name of Scott (I am not sure why this was not until the 22nd of June). I have heard nothing in return.

Since I would in any case have expected to have heard something by now, I must send this further letter. As I previously advised, ordinary post between Mexico and the UK takes a minimum of two weeks, and can take over six weeks. Email to the address given above would therefore be the more practical means of correspondence. I must use ordinary post this time, as I cannot afford to keep sending DHL letters with my situation becoming increasingly precarious.

In addition to a completed copy of the original form, I enclose a copies of the following for your information and to further confirm my identity:

- four pages from my Certificate of Service
- a copy of my birth certificate
- proof of delivery of the original application

I have no bank account or other means of receiving payment in the UK. However, I have an HSBC account in Mexico, details of which are:
